

# PETER FURLONG

## TENOR

Tenor **Peter Furlong** has been universally praised by both national and international press, with The New York Times saying ‘Peter’s strong singing and magisterial tenor [was the] strongest vocal showing of the night pumping out sound and effect’. He has appeared to plaudits on stages around the world including Berlin and Dortmund, Germany; Lugo, Brescia, and Milan, Italy; Wexford, Ireland; New York, NY; Denver, CO; and Santa Fe, NM.

His recent engagements include the roles of Adam in *Der Vogelhändler* and Max in *Der Freischütz* in Berlin, Cavaradossi with Abilene Opera, Dicapo Opera, and Opera New England; Don Gomez in a concert performance of *Die Drei Pintos* with the internationally acclaimed Gulbenkian Orchestra (Lisbon); and of Tony in ‘The Servant’ by Marco Tutino at Teatro Rossini, Lugo (Italia), all to critical acclaim.

Other notable engagements include his Czech and Hungarian debuts with the role of Tony in *The Servant*; his creation of the role of Salamone Mortara in the world premier of *Il caso Mortara* by Francesco Cilluffo, which caused a sensation in both Italy and New York; and Pinkerton in both the Brescia and Paris versions of *Madama Butterfly* in New York and Berlin.

Mr. Furlong’s concert appearances with full orchestra include concerts ranging from New Year’s concerts for three years in a row, to a celebration of British Music, and finally to Italian favourites concerts in and around Berlin, Germany. In addition, Mr Furlong recorded Mahler’s *Das Lied von der Erde* in September of 2016 to be released in time for Christmas.

Peter has produced and performed in very successful concerts including; *Three Tenors and a Soprano* as part of the Summer Music Associates series in New London, NH, *Lovers’ Quarrels*, arias and duets from the dsfunctional world of opera in Manchester, NH, *Three Tenors* concert at the Saint-Gaudens National Historic site in Cornish, NH, and a *Liederabends* of US Civil War songs and British Folksongs both in Antwerp, Belgium and at the Saint-Gaudens National Historic Site.
